


# STUDENT ELECTIONS

- Citizen Science






## **MEET THE FLEET**


We know that the Students are very proud of their school and it was heartening to see them showcase to you all.

## Technology in the classroom

As an Academy, we have invested in One:One devices so that within each lesson, students have access to the latest technology. This is to support their learning, including digital literacy, in preparation for the world beyond education.

Our subject specialist teachers have been focusing on how they can incorporate the use of the One:One device within lessons to enhance learning and foster academic excellence.

Over the course of this term we have introduced the device to the Students and worked to ensure that they are able to meet the 5 sails to success in every aspect.

# **5 SAILS TO SUCCESS**

At the Maritime we have devised a One:One success criteria to support our Students to know and understand the expectations when using their device both in school and at home.





1.Students will show the values of Strength, Pride and Unity with their One:One device.



2. Students will bring their One:One device to school every day fully charged and ready for the day ahead.



3. Students will display behaviours of good digital citizens by protecting their personal information, use good judgment, respect their device and treat others with respect.



4. Students will only use their One:One device when directed to by their teacher.



5. Students will complete work on their One:One device to the deadlines set and seek support if they need it.

**Developing Strength of Character** 

We know that for children to be successful at school, they need to attend school every day. Missing school means missing out on vital learning and therefore we take any absence from school very seriously.

It is our ambition that all students attend school 100% of the time. Where there are any unavoidable absences in extreme circumstances, each student's attendance does not drop below 97%.

- 54% Students still have 100% attendance
- 74% Students have over 97% attendance

If your child's attendance is below the expected minimum of 97%, please support them to attend the Academy every day in Term 2 to improve their overall percentage.

#### September 2024 update


